



2018 WAS A RECORD BREAKING YEAR AT H.O.P.E.!

Our mission at H.O.P.E. for Animals is to eliminate the preventable euthanasia of companion animals by offering High-Quality Low-Cost spay/neuter and wellness services, by supporting rescue, and promoting responsible pet ownership.

Since opening our doors in 2010, the euthanasia rate at our local shelters has been reduced by 78%! Which means our clinic is saving more lives than ever before.

In 2018, we worked our “tails” off to ensure we helped as many pets and people as possible. We assisted over 20 animal shelters and rescues in Indiana, Michigan and Ohio. We spent thousands of hours on our TNR (Trap, Neuter, Return) program helping as many community cats and caretakers as we could. In addition, we provided financial assistance to over 3,000 pet owners to ensure they had a way to care for their pets.


And some really exciting news! On December 4th, 2018, we reached another incredible milestone.

We performed our 80,000th surgery!

With the help of supporters like you, we’ve been able to prevent well over a quarter of a million dogs and cats from struggling to survive on the streets of Northeast Indiana or being needlessly euthanized simply because there are not enough homes for them all.

Even with our great success, pet overpopulation remains the number one cause of death and suffering for companion animals. It’s a problem we can FIX – but only with your help. H.O.P.E. for Animals is a 501c3 non-profit organization which means we rely on the kind contributions of our donors to continue saving lives of pets in need. 

Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) Saved Lives in 2018:

Recently, feral cats have been in the local news as cities try to figure out how to deal with them. We've been excited to work with partners like the **Allen County SPCA** and **Fort Wayne Animal Care & Control** to help humanely control feral cat colonies. In a TNR program, feral cats are humanely trapped, then neutered, vaccinated, microchipped and ear-tipped before being returned to their outdoor homes. TNR stops the breeding cycle and stabilizes the size of the colony so it will decline naturally and humanely over time. Through grant funding and the help of supporters like you, coupled with our expanded surgical capacity, we spayed or neutered 2,915 community cats in 2018!



Assistance Fund



Donations and grants enabled H.O.P.E. for Animals to offer subsidized spay/neuter surgeries and wellness services for over 3,100 animals throughout 2018. It's hard for many of us to imagine not having enough money to care for our beloved pets. But that is the reality for many cat and dog caregivers in our region. **H.O.P.E. helps people spay, neuter, and vaccinate their pets at prices they can afford.** By eliminating the financial barrier that stops many pet parents from having their animals fixed, H.O.P.E. can proactively prevent pet homelessness.

FREE VACCINE CLINIC

On June 28th, 2018 we held a free vaccine clinic sponsored by Avangrid Renewables. In a single day, over 300 pets were able to get the help they needed! Thank you to H.O.P.E. staff, volunteers and Avangrid Renewables.



PEDAL FOR PAWS

Where else can you drink \$1 beer and wine, pedal on pedal cars, play raffles, AND help animals?! At our Pedal for Paws fundraiser, of course! This is not just a fundraiser, it's a FUNdraiser! In 2018, our guests helped raise over \$7,000 to help animals in need.



FELINE FALL FESTIVAL

Each year we invite the community to join us as we build community cat shelters for outdoor cats so they can be safe and warm during the winter months. In 2018 we, along with help from a lot of great volunteers and visitors, were able to build 200 shelters! Throughout the winter we offered these shelters free of charge to community cat caretakers in need. This community project was funded by generous sponsorships and private donors.



HIP TO SNIP

Our largest fundraiser, the Hip to Snip Fur-ball Bash was a great success. We had nearly 300 guests and filled every single sponsorship spot. In total, over \$56,000 was raised to support our great work!



🐾 Donations - Friends, supporters, and businesses gave both monetary and item donations, including donations of volunteer time.


