

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO HAVE A FEEDING STATION FOR COMMUNITY CATS?

Outdoor cats need a clean, sheltered place to eat. Feeding stations ensure a dry place to eat, and gives all of the cats an opportunity to eat - not just those who come out when the caretaker arrives.



City Ordinances for Feeding Stations

- Food may only be provided between the hours of 6:00am and 9:00am daily.
- To ensure the proper nutrition, only dry or moist food specifically designed for cats is to be used.
- The volume of food provided will depend on the number of Community Cats as well as their size.



Helpful Tips

- If all of the food is eaten within 15 minutes, you may want to provide more food.
- Not all cats will eat at the same time. Do not worry, this is normal.
- Remove uneaten food at the end of the feeding time to keep insects and wildlife away.



TNR (Trap, Neuter, Return)

These feeding stations are also the most likely location to achieve humane trapping of cats that require processing as a Community Cat.
