



In August, we partnered with the Humane Society of the United States and rescued 50 beagles! The dogs came from the Evigo breeding facility where 4,000 beagles were housed to later be sold for medical testing and subsequent euthanasia. Our first transport included 25 males and our second 25 female dogs! These beagles were not your average shelter dogs and needed extra care and patience. We were thrilled all of the beagles found homes and our lives were forever changed too.
