

Public - Community Cat - Trapper

Major Objective:

The Humane Fort Wayne Community Cat Program has a goal of spaying/neutering, and vaccinating 250 community cats in the Ridgebrook Hills (46818) by the end of 2023. This will significantly reduce the number of cats entering Fort Wayne Animal Care & Control (FWACC) and being euthanized there due to space, helping to achieve No Kill at FWACC and subsequently, all of Allen County.

Responsibilities:

- 1. Humanely trap Ridgebrook Hills outdoor cats and transport them to our clinic for spay/neuter surgery.
- 2. Safely transport/return cats to Ridgebrook Hills and release them

Time Commitment and Location of Work:

- 1. Trapping should happen in the mornings ideally, between 5-7 AM.
- 2. Release will happen after they are discharged from surgery, usually 3 PM the following day.
- 3. Flexible on frequency.
- 4. This is an on-going opportunity.

Qualifications:

- 1. Previous trapping experience is ideal, but not required. Training is provided.
- 2. Successful completion of the Community Cat Volunteer Orientation.
- 3. Proof of insurance, valid driver's license, and satisfactory driving record
- 4. Must be comfortable handling/lifting traps. Cats are sometimes non-socialized, fractious and/or feral

Requirements:

- 1. Must be able to routinely lift 20-30 lbs
- 2. Must be able to work outdoors in all weather conditions
- 3. Must be able to bend, stoop, hike, walk, kneel and lift
- 4. Must be able to work well with the public
- 5. Must work within the guidelines of the Community Cat Volunteer Program as outlined in the Community Cat Volunteer Orientation & Standard Operating Procedures (SOP)
- 6. Must have a temperature controlled vehicle (Van, SUV or a truck with a topper to transport cats in traps.

- 1. Community Cat Coordinator
- 2. Volunteer Development Coordinator
