



Poor Legend was in rough shape. His skin was severely irritated. His eyes were swollen and he couldn't see well. He had entropion – an abnormality where his eyelids rolled inward, causing discomfort and irritation. But his spirit is what stole our hearts. In spite of all his challenges, Legend wanted to love and be loved in return.

We spent weeks treating Legend with eye ointments, allergy medications, prescription food, and soothing baths. He had corrective eye surgery at Monon Veterinary Clinic performed by both their vet, Dr. Sam, and our vet, Dr. Gamble!

Soon, Legend was feeling so much better! He'd gone from pain and uncertainty to having a new excitement for life and tons of energy. This goofy lover needed some work on his manners, so our behavioral team made a plan and got to work getting him ready for his forever home.

In late November, Legend found his forever family. His new mom and dad were immediately smitten, and he loves his new canine sister, MooMoo, who was also adopted from us.

Legend's journey is not just the story of a dog's resilience, but of a village coming together to transform the life of a pet in need. And thanks to YOU, Legend now has a new leash on life.





So instead, we got to work. For over two months, our staff and volunteers cared for the felines every day until she recovered. We cleaned out the shed, set up winter shelters, and filled them with fresh straw.

And as we got to know all their purr-sonalities, it was evident why she loved this colony so much. One of our wonderful volunteers even built a custom feeding station so our friend could easily feed the cats without going down any steps!
