On behalf of the tens of thousands of animals we were able to help in 2025, thank you! It's hard to believe that it's already been five years since the Allen County SPCA, HOPE for Animals, and the Fort Wayne Pet Food Pantry merged to become Humane Fort Wayne.

In those same five years, we built our state-of-the-art Sharon Bodenhafer Critter Center on St. Francis Drive, and we were awarded the prestigious \$1 million grant from PetSmart Charities to increase access to affordable veterinary care!

Today, Humane Fort Wayne employs 80 full and part time staff and boasts nearly 200 active volunteers. The growth we've experienced has been downright incredible. And it's only been possible because this community has invested their hearts and their dollars in our mission to serve as a trusted partner, providing comprehensive, lifesaving resources to pets and their people.

But we won't stop now. We can't. The expansion of our services has revealed even more the true need in our community.

So, what's next? With both our clinics and our shelter fully functioning, we will now turn our attention to our flagship facility, the former ACSPCA on Hanna and Pettit. Since the mergers in 2021, Hanna Street has been home to our Pet Promises program and has been the hub of our pet food pantry. My vision for that location is to renovate the entire facility to become Indiana's only freestanding social service agency for pets and people. We'll repurpose the now-empty kennels to provide more emergency housing for pets in crisis, expand outreach to the neighborhood, and ensure that wrap-around services are available to the pets who need us most.

Additionally, we are committed to serving as an incubator for more young people interested in veterinary medicine by partnering with area schools and vocational programs so that students can learn hands-on how to professionally care for animals. It's our hope to help create the next generation of animal welfare professionals right here in our own community.

Again, it is only because of your support that we have the audacity to dream this big. To save and serve so many animals. To be a lifeline for the pets and people who have the greatest need.

We couldn't have gotten here without you, and because of you, we'll go further still. Join us please, as we continue to change the landscape of animal welfare in Fort Wayne and beyond.

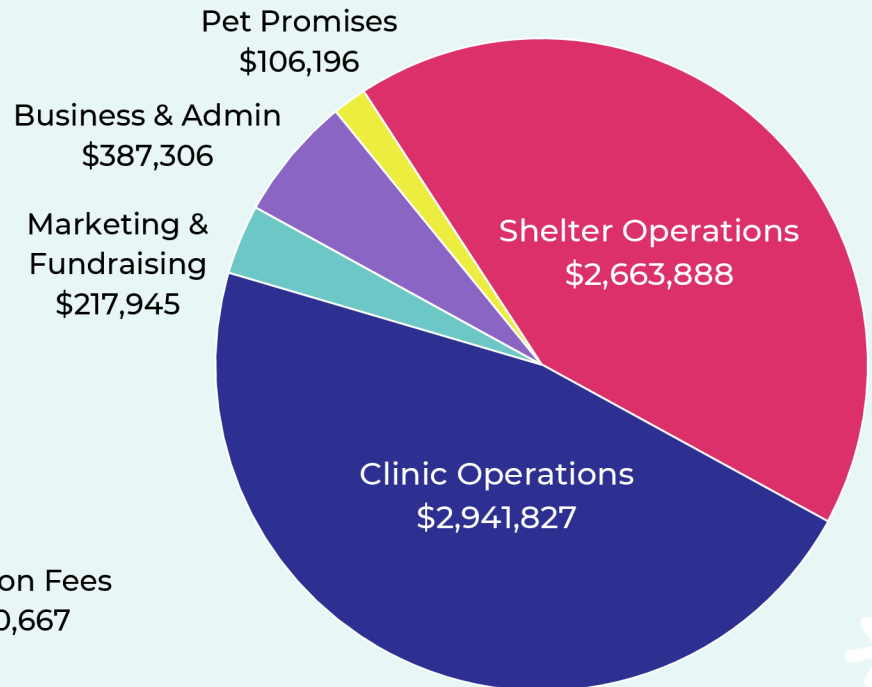
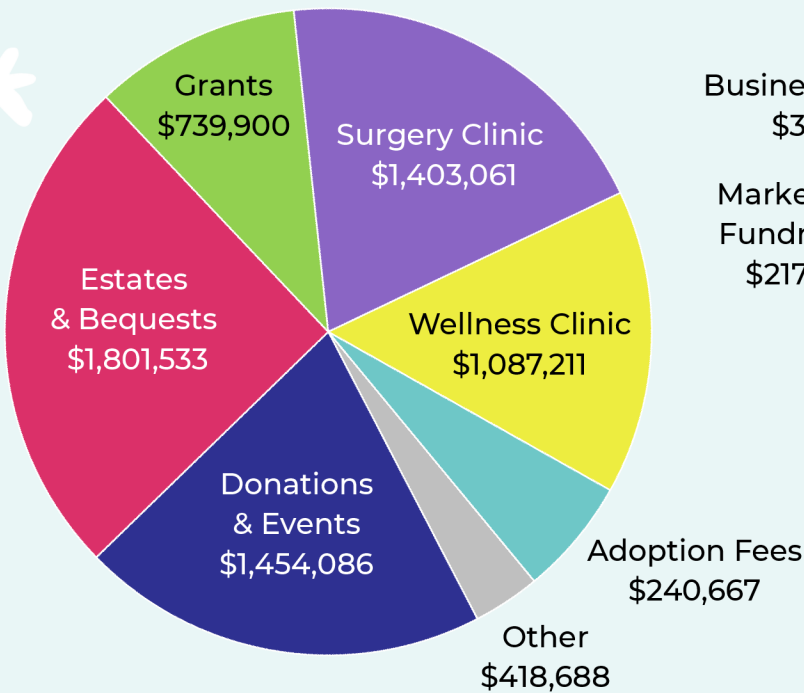

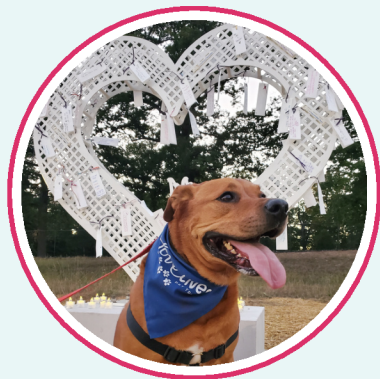
COMMUNITY: Building Together

FOSTERING SAVES LIVES: A Sunny Second Chance: Ray's Story

When Ray arrived at Humane Fort Wayne, she was dangerously emaciated — her body a quiet testament to a long period of struggle. She had come in alongside her companion, Charlie, surrendered by an overwhelmed caretaker who, in asking for help, gave both dogs their greatest chance.

Charlie was healthy enough to be vetted and adopted quickly. Ray's road would take longer.

Ray entered a foster home to begin the slow, careful work of healing. From the moment she arrived, her foster family could feel the tension humming through her. On her first night, they gave her a warm bath — not out of necessity, but in the hope that warmth and gentle touch would signal calm and care. Trust came in small moments: a relaxed sigh, a tentative tail wag, and the gradual realization that sudden movements no longer needed to be feared. Healing didn't happen in grand gestures. It happened in hundreds of everyday moments of gentleness, consistency, and compassion.

That's what fostering really is — not just giving a dog a temporary place to stay, but being present for the delicate, beautiful process of a frightened heart learning to feel safe again. Ray was their third foster, and like every dog before her, she reminded them that trust can be rebuilt, that kindness has ripples, and that even small acts can change a life.

Every foster placement is backed by veterinary care, nutritional resources, and staff coordination made possible by this community's generosity. Ray's journey to her goal weight of 35 pounds represented weeks of that investment paying off.

Then something extraordinary happened. Just as Ray was being prepared for adoption, Charlie's new family saw her story. They knew the two dogs had lived together before coming into care. They knew what they had to do. When Charlie and Ray were reunited in the meet and greet room, just like that, Ray was home.

If you've ever wondered whether fostering might be right for you, consider this your invitation. You don't have to be ready for forever to make a difference. Sometimes, being a safe place for now is exactly what a dog needs.

Stories like Ray's are why this work matters and why this community is so powerful.

Foster Program

In 2025, we had 1,862 pets in foster - 305 dogs and 1,557 cats! This includes the 592 pets in foster through our Show Me the Mommy Program!

Show Me the Mommy is a program that allows owners to keep the mother animal at home, and once the babies are weaned, they enter the shelter's adoption program. Humane Fort Wayne provides all supplies, food, and medical care for free — and will also spay the mom at no cost.

Increasing Access to Care

Kim and Honey are soulmates. So when Kim noticed that Honey had stopped eating, she knew right away that something was wrong.

Kim's budget was already stretched thin, but she couldn't watch Honey suffer. And so, Kim didn't hesitate to use her utility money to take her cherished companion to the vet, thinking she'd just need some antibiotics and TLC.

But things were a lot more serious. Honey had a life-threatening pyometra (uterine infection) and to survive, she would need emergency surgery. Kim had no idea how she could afford the expensive procedure, but she couldn't give up on her best friend.

Desperate, Kim started calling every place she could find within a 50 mile radius on the off chance that she might be able to get some help. That's when she found us.

Thanks to the Accelerator Grant from PetSmart Charities, Humane Fort Wayne is working hard to increase access to affordable veterinary care in our community. And because of their support, we didn't have to hesitate to offer Kim the care that Honey urgently needed.

We scheduled Honey's surgery right away at our Spay/Neuter Clinic and one of our surgeons successfully performed the emergency surgery that would save her life.

After a cozy nap with blankets and snacks from our staff, Honey was ready to go home. When Kim came to pick her up, there wasn't a dry eye in the room. Their love for each other was evident to all of us.

Honey is recovering well in the loving home where she belongs, and we're beyond grateful to have been part of her journey.



Increasing Access to Care

Clinic Plus

2025 marked our first (of three) funded year from the PetSmart Charities Accelerator Grant. We utilized that installment to hire more staff to be able to offer weekend wellness hours and to launch Clinic Plus - expanded veterinary care beyond the basics.

Our Clinic Plus Clinic offers a range of basic and supportive care services for pets, including:

- Skin and ear care
- Mild sedated exams (CHILL)
- Technician-only services
- Euthanasia services



No One Should Say Goodbye Alone

When Leslie's dog Prince Naughty was near the end of his life, she faced an impossible situation; she couldn't afford a vet, but couldn't bear for him to die alone. The municipal shelter could euthanize him, but the family wouldn't be allowed in the room, so a staff member pointed her to Humane Fort Wayne.

There, the Pet Promises and Clinic+ teams quickly arranged a compassionate send-off. The exam room was set with soft comforters, a dog bed, and a sound machine playing birdsongs. Leslie and her daughter stayed by Prince's side. Her husband carried him in. They had the time and the space to say goodbye. When the family was ready, they invited the vet in themselves.

That last detail, giving the family control over that moment, was intentional. Every part of the experience was shaped by staff asking: If this were our pet, what would we want this to feel like?

Affordable, humane euthanasia means no family and no pet has to face that moment alone. As a client once put it: "When you really love something, you lose it hard." Grief is the price of love — and families deserve dignity and support when paying it.
